6.1 Q&A	Q1: A parent brought up the U15DS to U18B Transition concerns as a number of U15DS majors did not make a spot on the newly formed U18B Team.	N/A
	 Charles Eddie explained The transition from U15DS to 18B is a difficult transition, the coach was more than likely concerned about the players handling the fast-paced game and challenges associated with U18B level hockey. 	
	Q2: A Parent asked how the MGHL is working towards increasing the female coaching numbers.	
	 Darcy Breakey: MGHL works hard to have more female coaches get involved. This past season MGHL had 9 female coaches. The League actively works to get more volunteers and offers to pay for certifications to coach. We've sought out some female coaches and brought them into our organization, so it's something that we would like to see continue to grow. There will be more efforts in the coming seasons to get more coaches. 	
	Q3: Why are there no full ice practices for House League when our registration fees are equal to, or greater than, other associations that all have full ice practices, especially at the U13 and U15 levels?	
	 Scott Forsyth: We're pretty low on the registration fees, especially at the U13 level. It all comes down to the amount of ice we have available. If we gave every team a full hour of ice for an individual practice, we would have mostly teams going from 7 AM Till 8 PM Saturday and Sunday, and there isn't enough ice for us for that. 	
	Q4: A parent inquired how new association players can navigate a fair look for skills and assessments when some rep coaches do not respond to email inquiries or follow-ups?	
	 Brad Saunders: I know that several of our AA and A coaches spent time scouting players from other organizations that reached out to them again. I know the coaches did the work on that side of things. We've seen parents be proactive with online videos and whatnot that have come to coaches. We encourage all of our coaches to be as communicative as possible. Some coaches are better than others; some

We hope that any coach within the MGHL uses lines of communication to let parents of prospective players know whether they're on the radar or not. That's often the complaint for many parents, that they don't know exactly where their kid might stand. But again, at any point during the year depending on where it is, the coaches have a lot to consider.	
	 Charles Eddie: I'll just add to that, there was a total of 3 people that reached out to me with coaches being non-responsive, and all 3 of them were dealt with. As a reminder, if anybody has any questions or concerns or wants to talk about things as they're developing, or what the opportunities are for their players, I am always here to help.
